Since 1974, National Catholic Schools Week is the annual celebration of Catholic education in the United States. It starts the last Sunday in January and runs all week, which in 2022 is January 27th – February 5th. The theme for National Catholic Schools Week 2022 is "Catholic Schools: Faith. Excellence. Service." Schools typically observe the annual celebration week with Mass, Rosaries and other activities for students, families, parishioners and community members. Through these events, schools focus on the value Catholic education provides to young people and its contributions to our church, our communities and our nation.

For Students: Free Dress for all students who wore their uniforms to their parish mass on Saturday/Sunday. Print off and have your parent sign the attached Free Dress Day Pass and turn it in to your teacher! **(following guidelines must be adhered to - see below).**

"Catholic Schools Monday Free Dress Guidelines

These days are a privilege. Students are expected to choose appropriate school wear following the guidelines and rules listed for the school uniform. Modesty and good taste are expected. Administration and staff reserve the right to judge what is appropriate and acceptable. Students found to be "out of appropriate dress" will not be allowed into class."

Parents and Students should note the following:

- Jeans and uniform shorts can be worn
- Pajama Pants are not permitted
- Clothing can be neither under-sized nor over-sized.
- The length of skirts must still adhere to the uniform guidelines (3 inches from the middle of the knee.)
- Shorts other than uniform shorts are not permitted
- Leggings and Jeggings are not permitted
- Makeup is not permitted
- Restrictions include, but are not limited to, spaghetti-strap tops, biker shorts, short shorts, cut-offs, midriff shirts, pajama-style clothing, or clothing with inappropriate slogans/pictures.
- Shoes must be appropriate for Recess and P.E. class. NO sandals are permitted at any time.
- Socks must be blue, black, white or grey

For Teachers: Student Leaders will start off the day by delivering a continental breakfast to teachers via our "breakfast cart"!
